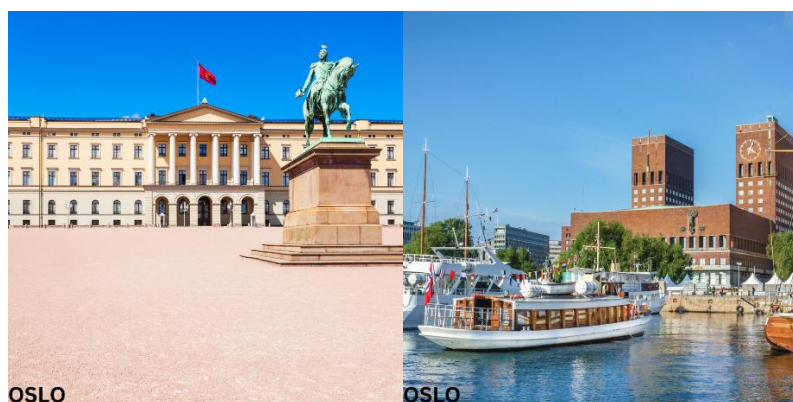

Day 1: Depart for overnight flight to Oslo, Norway

Departure from Florida to Oslo: (Looking for best flight option)

Day 2: Arrive in Oslo

Arrive early afternoon in Oslo as our guide will meet us at the airport. The rest of the afternoon is at leisure with a Welcome Dinner at the hotel this evening. (Included)

Day 3: Oslo [B]

After breakfast, a local English-speaking guide will escort us on a half day of sightseeing in Oslo. We'll visit the Holmenkollen Ski Jump Museum, the oldest of its kind in the world, presenting over 4,000 years of skiing history and Norwegian polar exploration. The new modern Ski Jump is an Oslo landmark, and the observation deck offers panoramic views of Oslo. This afternoon venture across the street from the hotel to the new Oslo Opera House, built to resemble a glacier. Its sloping Carrara marble roof is a public pedestrian plaza, revealing different angles of the inner city and the picturesque Aker brygge harbor. You'll visit Vigeland Sculpture Park where impressive bronze sculptures can be viewed. You'll also see City Hall, and the waterfront. Overnight at Comfort Hotel Grand Central – Oslo.

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Day 4: Oslo [B]

Breakfast is served at the hotel in the morning. The rest of the day is free to explore on your own arrangements.

Day 5: Norway in a Nutshell [B]

Starting from Oslo, you first set out on a westbound train journey through scenic mountain terrain on the Bergen Railway. Upon arrival in Myrdal, you disembark and change trains to the legendary Flåm Railway. The Flåm Railway offers spectacular panoramic views to some of the wildest and most magnificent nature in the Norwegian fjord landscape.

Day 8: Norway in a Nutshell Continued [B]

Your journey continues from Flåm with a fjord cruise on the magnificent Aurlandsfjord and on the and dramatic and narrow Nærøyfjord. The Aurlandsfjord is a picturesque fjord that offers stunning views, while the Nærøyfjord is a dramatic fjord surrounded by high mountains. Nærøyfjorden is one of the narrowest fjords in Europe and included on UNESCO's World Heritage List. After your fjord cruise, you arrive in the small village of Gudvangen, nestled in the innermost part of Nærøyfjorden.

From here the journey continues with a bus trip through the valleys, with its charming villages and scenic nature landscape. From May-September the bus travels down the steep hairpin bends of Stalheimskleiva. The bus will arrive in Voss, where you continue the tour by train on the Bergen Railway to Bergen. Perhaps cap the day by riding up the funicular to the top of 2,000-foot-tall "Mount" Fløyen for city and fjord views.

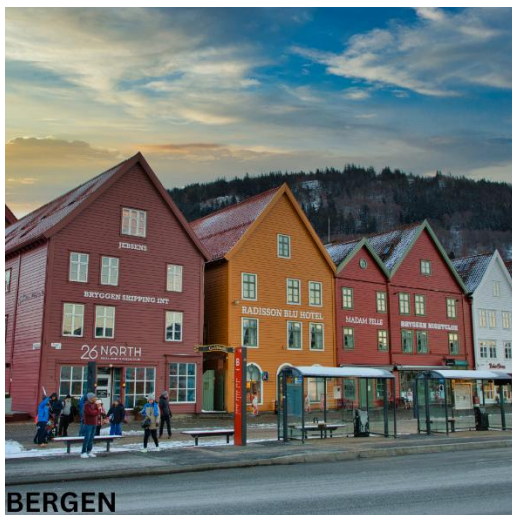

Day 9: Bergen [B]



A UNESCO World Heritage city, ancient Bergen looms large in Viking sagas. Until the 14th century, it was the seat of the medieval kingdom of Norway. In 1360, the German Hanseatic League set up one of its

import and export offices at Bryggen, dominating trade for almost 400 years. This history comes alive as we join our English-speaking guide for a walk along the historic Bryggen wharf and visit the Hanseatic Museum, in an old merchant house. Seafaring Bergen has given the world two cultural icons – playwright Henrik Ibsen and composer Edvard Grieg. Late morning, drive to Troidhaugen, the home of Edvard Grieg and his wife. This typical 19th century residence with a panoramic tower and large veranda overlooks Nordas Lake. Visit the house where Greig spent his last 22 years, the museum, the graveyard, and the hut where he composed music. After time for a light lunch (on own) at the Troidhaugen Café, enjoy a concert of Grieg's music in a special concert hall. Tour ends at the hotel and the remaining of the day is at leisure to explore the old city. Stroll through the narrow alleyways and overhanging galleries of a bygone era, from the lively Fish Market to the Bergenhus Fortress, with cafés and boutiques selling traditional and unique crafts. Perhaps climb Rosenkrantz Tower for a panorama of Bergen's seaport
